### **PATIENT LIST**

As promised, an update on the current situation with printed lists. The following key changes have been requested and will be implemented soon:

- 1. Remove 'primary contact'
- 2. Diagnosis lists top 3 only
- 3. Code status shortened

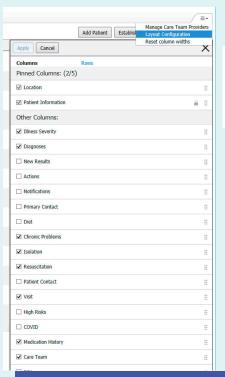
#### On detailed list only:

- 4. Medications shortened, grouped by scheduled and PRN
- 5. Situational awareness and Actions for your Care Team only

#### THIS WEEK I LEARNED

I have been looking for years for a way to display the Attending Physician face-up on my patient overview. Turns out it was there all along! Just add the 'Care Team' column to your Patient Overview by clicking on the 'hamburger menu' and then 'Layout Configuration.' Once you've added the column, you'll have to click in one of the boxes in a patient row to open a side panel. From there, select 'Display Physician' and viola! The attending physician now displays on your Overview. Now's also a good opportunity to clean up your columns on Patient Overview if you haven't for a while. See below for my suggestion on which columns to include:

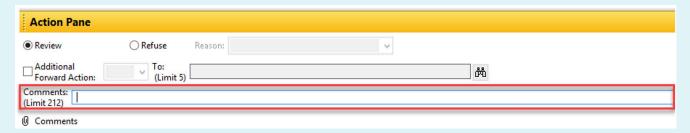

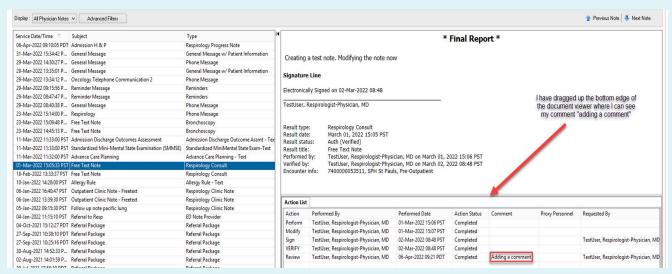

# HOW TO LEAVE COMMENTS ON REVIEWED RESULTS

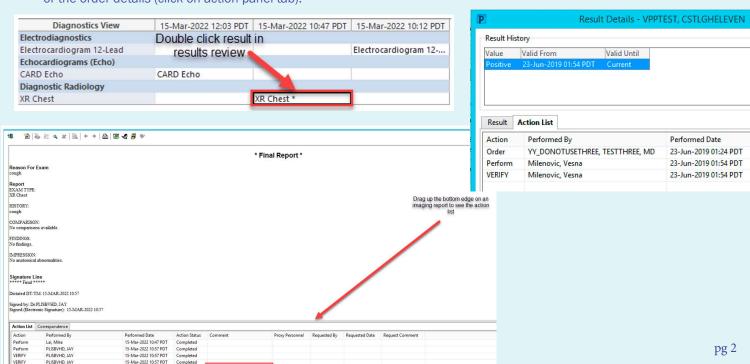
When documents, labs, and medical imaging land in your message center, you are able to leave a comment on these results in the Action Pane.



Comments left in this way become part of the record attached to that result, and can be viewed later by pulling up the 'Action List' for that result. For documents, pull up the bottom pane when viewing the document in the 'Documents' tab:

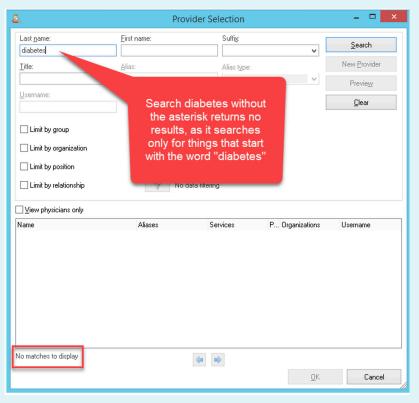


For lab or imaging results, double click in the result cell to bring up the document (action panel is at the bottom) or the order details (click on action panel tab):



## WILDCARD SEARCH

Finding the listing for the person or clinic you want to get a copy of note can be frustrating. The default search only looks for exact matches, based on the start of the 'name':



While the fact that the search is not smarter than this is a source of great dismay for me personally, there is a trick which can make it more tolerable to try to CC the Diabetes Clinic on your note. Using an asterisk \* with your search terms forces the system to look for that word anywhere in the entry rather than just at the beginning. You must place the asterisk at the beginning of your search term:
